28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are many messages in today's Gospel: the power of God to heal, the compassion of Jesus for those in need, the fact that a despised foreigner (the Samaritan) is the only one who recognises what has been done, the role of faith and the importance of thanking God for gifts received. But because this Gospel is twinned with part of the story of Naaman the leper, the idea that the Church brings out most clearly is that of thanksgiving, or acknowledging what has been given to us. From an early age we are taught to say "Thank You" - to recognise that someone has gone out of their way to give us something or do something for us. Our thanks strengthens the relationship that binds us together, and it is the same with God. As we recognise the good things that come from God, so our faith is deepened and the bond of the Covenant in Christ Jesus is strengthened.

Prisoners' Sunday - 12th October. The Church calls upon us to remember prisoners and their families at Mass this weekend. We pray especially for any people from our families or parishes who are in prison at this time. Prisons are in crisis, and life for prisoners and their families in our communities is challenging. Pact, the national Catholic prison charity, supports prisoners, their families and their children, offering them hope and the chance to turn their lives around.

Developing Parish Welcome Teams: - The Diocese of Salford Synod 2025 recommends that: "all parishes should retain and develop the welcome team as a feature of parish life". While we do have some people at most of our Masses who act as welcomers, it would be good to increase the teams who do this and remind ourselves of the best way to do it. If you are willing to help with this ministry, give your name to one of the welcomers and we will arrange some guidance in the near future.

Sycamore (RCIA): Do you want to become a Catholic or learn more about the faith? A great start to our new course learning about the Catholic Faith. All still welcome to come along this week on Tuesday 14th October at 7pm in the Narthex at St Mary's. This week the session is entitled: "The Holy Spirit and the Church", including the ideas: "How the Holy Spirit can change your life". 5B – "No one gets into heaven alone". 5C – "Why we need signs, symbols and sacraments".

First Holy Communion Programme: Both parishes will be starting the preparation for First Holy Communion very soon. Children in Year Three at our Parish Schools will receive a letter inviting them to join the programme. If your child is at another school or in a higher year group and you would like them to make their First Communion, please contact the Parish Office and we will give you an application form.

Sacramental Programme: The first session for the First Communion Programme for St Mary's took place on Wednesday and the children will be presented this Sunday at 9.30 am Mass.

The 'Celebration of Human Dignity' event, which is aligned with the memorial of St Pope John Paul II who championed human dignity and the value of human life in his many works, will include music, thought-provoking sessions and Sunday Mass celebrated by Bishop John Arnold. in all the places we visited. This lovely book is on our Jubilee display table. Many thanks to Clare for producing such a wonderful little book!
